



Enhance the professional growth and advancement of women in the geosciences

Who is Eligible?

- Undergraduate women committed to completing a Bachelor's Degree and pursuing a career or graduate work in the **geosciences**, including:
 - Geology, environmental/engineering geology, geochemistry, geophysics, hydrogeology or hydrology.
- Sophomore, junior, or senior women enrolled in a university or 2-year college in the states of **Washington or Oregon**.
- Minimum of 3.2 GPA (or equivalent academic achievement).

Applicants will be judged on their potential for professional success, academic achievements, and financial need.

Recipient will be notified by February 17, 2017 with the award in early spring of 2017.

What you need to submit:

- Name, mailing address, phone number and email
- One paragraph each describing your (1) financial needs, (2) current financial resources, and (3) academic achievements.
- One-page essay summarizing your commitment to a career in the geosciences.
- All college transcripts (photocopies and scanned copies accepted).
- 3 letters of reference (via mail or email); including their names, affiliations, and contact phone numbers, sent to us directly:
 - 2 people familiar with your academic **achievement and personal** commitment, at least one of whom is a geoscience faculty member,
 - 1 person familiar with your financial needs. This person may be a relative or friend.

You may submit additional letters of reference.

Please note: Incomplete or late applications cannot be considered.
